Megan Siarey and David Muir are the new people in charge of the IMHN.




The IMHN met with some people with mental health illnesses and learning disabilities to talk about the different mental health hospitals in the area.

Hard of Hearing Forum

The Hard of Hearing Forum supports people who have difficulty with hearing.



They sent a letter to complain about there not being enough services to remove ear wax in Surrey.





Surrey Vision Action Group (SVAG) help people who cannot see or have difficulty seeing.



They talked about whether the new REACT system should be used in Surrey.



The REACT system reads out information at bus stops, like when the next bus is coming.

We hope to know more by October.

Physical Disability and Sensory Impairment (PDSI) Strategy



Surrey County Council are writing a new plan called the 'Physical Disability and Sensory Impairment Strategy'.



This will look at what support disabled people in Surrey need.

We are making a website for people who want to learn new skills to help them get a job.




It will be called Skill Up Surrey.

Everyone had the chance to have a go at sailing a boat.




If you go, you do not have to sail a boat.


