

Surrey Coalition of Disabled People is run and managed by disabled people and people with a long-term health condition.




This is our annual report for 2022 to 2023.

How we work




We work to the Social Model of Disability.

The **Social Model of Disability** says that it's not your body that makes you disabled, it's the **barriers** put up by other people that stop you taking part.



A **barrier** is something that is put in your way. It makes it harder for you to do something.

We work to remove the barriers which are making you disabled.



We never stop trying to make things better.



We feel strongly about what we do.

We always speak up when something isn't fair.



We look for new ways to solve problems.



All Disabled people and people with a long-term health condition are equally important to us.

What we do








We work with disabled people and people living with a long-term health condition to:

- improve health and social care services.
- get the same rights for them as everyone else.
- campaign so that people can choose what they want and have control over their own lives.

A **campaign** is working to try and change something.

 help disabled people to live as independently as they want.



 campaign so that disabled people have the same chance of getting a job as everyone else.

• celebrate being different from most other people.

• be involved in our local communities.



• speak up about things with health and local council services.

Improving health and social care services



We work with health and care services as equal partners in improving services and setting up new projects.

This year we have been working on:

Special Interest Groups These groups are for people with particular conditions. The groups include:

- the Long-Term Neurological Conditions group
- The Hard of Hearing Forum









- The community equipment group
- The groups have been working with Surrey County Council on their plans for services for disabled people.



The Disability Empowerment Network

The Disability Empowerment Network is made up of groups of disabled people who meet to discuss issues that affect them.

Campaigning



We have been campaigning so that disabled people get fair access to all services, such as train travel.









Sharing information and resources

We have shared information and advice about health and care in different ways:

• Our weekly email to members.

• Our newsletter - every three months.

- A phone line where you can listen to a recording of the latest newsletters.
- We have put our latest newsletters onto Alexa.

Alexa is a smart speaker. You can ask it questions and it can give you spoken information, play music and let you listen to the radio.



Mental health and wellbeing

We work with the Independent Mental Health Network (IMHN).

• This year the network has been researching how we can work with mental health services.



FoCUS

 FoCUS stands for Forum of Carers and People who Use our Services.



New technology

Technology is gadgets and equipment that help people.

The 'Tech to Community Connect' project has grown a lot this year.



This project helps people to learn more about how to use computers and phones.

We have set up an online library of information for disabled people.



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We have been working with many volunteers. We called them 'Tech Angels'.

Tackling loneliness

Our social events have continued this year.

These included:

- some online social events. One of them is listening to music
- help for people to keep fit and active.

Family carers can be an **associate member**.

An **associate member** gets regular information from us but is not able to vote at the meetings.
